# Disconnect in the telecom policy

DoT has set sky-high targets, but no one knows who will foot the bill

he national digital communications policy, which comes six years after the previous one (then termed the national telecom policy) is not short on ambition. The department of telecommunications (DoT) has set some stiff targets. It wants to provide universal broadband coverage at a speed of 50 mbps to every citizen by 2022 (over five times the average current data speed at around 9.14 mbps) and fixed broadband access for half the country's households in the next five years.

At the same time, it is determined to ensure that there are as many as 5 million public wifi hotspots by 2020, and plans to double it within the next two years. And finally, the policy is also looking at enabling the backhaul network, or the intermediate network linkages, to be connected by fibre in at least 60 per cent of the country's mobile towers as opposed to the current practice of microwave links.

Achievable targets or fanciful goals? First, some perspective. Despite the hoopla of the data revolution kicked off by Reliance Jio, mobile broadband penetration at the end of 2017 was 31 per cent, half the global average and

lower than even Vietnam (36 per cent), Nigeria (42) and Indonesia (53), according to a GSMA Intelligence-Analysys Mason study. In rural India, where the bulk of the population lives, internet penetration is a woeful sub-15 per cent. To ensure that broadband will reach them would mean making enormous investments in areas where the private sector has not found it viable to put in large amounts of money.

Certainly, the telecom companies (telcos) see the new policy target as out of sync with reality. "To offer broadband access at 50 mbps to all, telcos would require over 400 MHz of spectrum each, ten times more than the average spectrum they have currently. And with

the huge base price tag fixed for spectrum by TRAI [the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India] and the industry's financial debt overhang, there is no question anyone will be able to put in the money to make it happen," says Rajan Mathews, director general of the Cellular Operators Association of India (COAI).

Based on member data, Mathews says telcos are collectively carrying a debt burden of ₹7,500 billion on their books on

revenue of \$33 billion (₹2,084 billion). TRAI's spectrum base price would require the industry to fork out ₹5,000 billion more. This level of investment does not gel with the government's new goal of "optimal spectrum usage" in place of the previous goal of "revenue maximisation".

# 'Extreme' Vespa enthusiasts rev up in Indonesia

Every year, Indonesians from teens and grandads, to mechanics and students, gather in eastern Java to celebrate their love of the iconic Italian Vespascooter.

For some, it's an 'extreme' kind of love, where the vehicles are customised to resemble metallic monster bikes straight out of a Hollywood dystopia.

Hundreds of enthusiasts travel to the festival in Kediri to show off their creations —ranging from restored vintage Vespas to Mad Max-style tanks fitted with fake machine guns, a dozen extra tyres, or eerie stuffed toys as hood ornaments.

To enter into competitions at the festival, every customised vehicle must have a Vespa engine and most contestants try to retain the brand's iconic fairing -the curved front of the scooter.

But other embellishments are up to the owners and their budgets. While many can only afford scrap metal or reused material found at a junkyard, some others splash out.

Peded, a 43-year-old grandfather who has been modifying Vespas since the 1990s, says he likes his scooter to "tell a story".

"I love decorating Vespas to the extreme, but I don't

like using trash," said Peded, whose Vespa sports massive buffalo horns from the Toraja tribal land on Sulawesi island.

The three-day festival, now in its third year, is one of several held across the country. Highlights include a contest to pick the best-looking entry and dirt-track races for the speedier bikes.

The enthusiasts attract glances and smiles from locals because of the designs of their elaborate Vespas.

As the vehicles are often unlicensed, many travel at night to avoid traffic police. Mechanical trouble is common, with some of the more ramshackle machines often breaking down.


